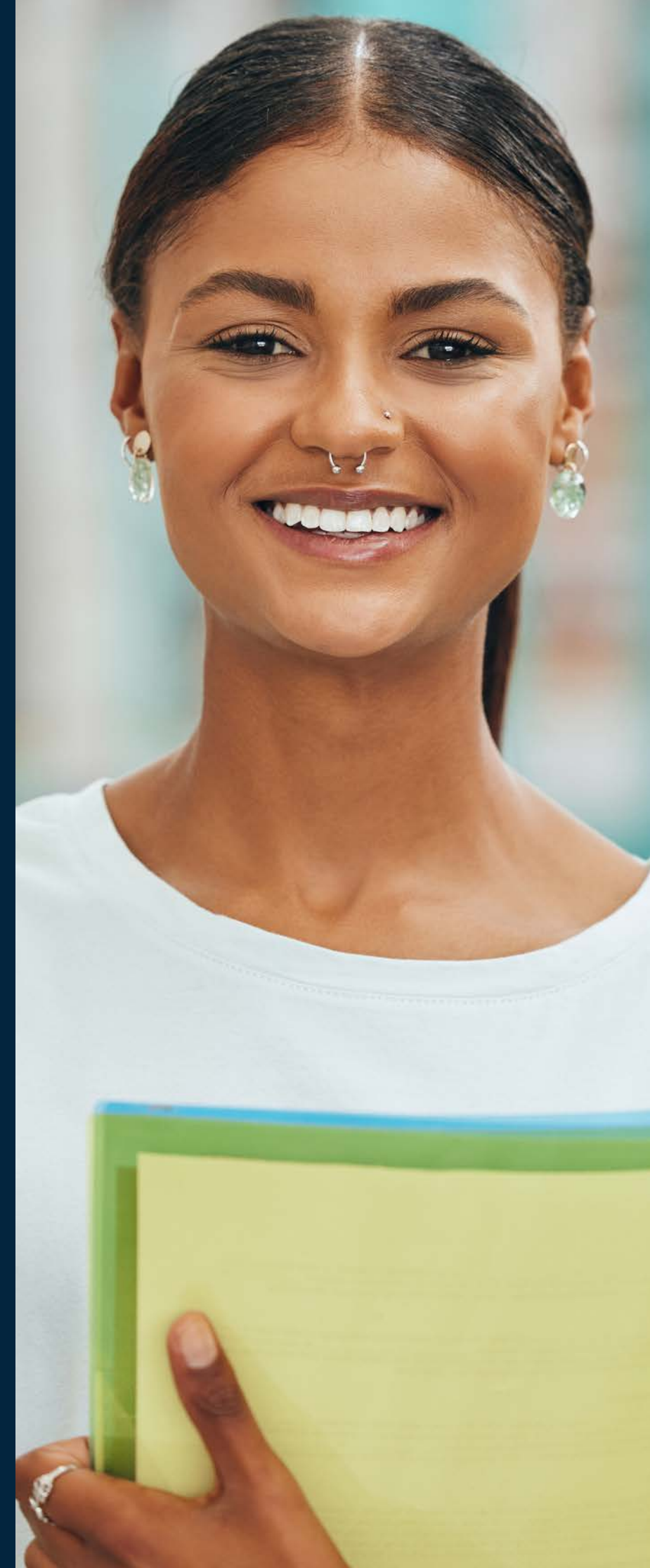

GENERAL INFORMATION

You will receive 20 face-to-face hours per week and 5 -10 hours of self-study. We offer flexible schedule to cater for your individual needs.

END OF COURSE CERTIFICATE

At the end of the course students will receive a Certificate of Attainment or a Certificate of Participation depending on their attendance and academic progress.

To receive a certificate of attainment, the student needs to meet the following requirements:

- Complete a minimum of 10 weeks of study at the current level (excluding official school break weeks).
- Maintain an attendance rate of 80% or above.
- Score 60% or higher in the Skills Test conducted at the current level.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Minimum age of 18*

STUDENT VISA HOLDERS REQUIREMENTS

Minimum Attendance: Your attendance must not be below 80%.

Daily Attendance: Student visa holders must attend all scheduled classes (20 hours a week).

Academic Progress: To maintain satisfactory course progress, students must complete a Skills Test every 5 study weeks and achieve 65% or above in each macro skill (listening, reading, writing and speaking).

Seeking Support: If you are struggling to maintain satisfactory course progress, you need to contact Albright student support services for assistance.

Consequences of Non-Compliance: Failure to comply with the attendance requirements may result in the implementation of attendance intervention strategies and cancellation of your enrolment.

General English

Course duration 84 weeks (max)

Our General English course is designed so that you can learn English developing the four essential macro-skills (Speaking, Reading, Writing and Listening) in a vibrant, engaging and interactive environment. We mix face-to-face delivery with the latest technology and extracurricular activities to help you enhance your English skills quickly and easily. Our teachers are accomplished professionals who can guarantee that your academic progress is seamless and consistent.

TEST

Students are required to sit a placement test prior to commencing their studies to ensure they enrol in the correct level. Progress Tests that assess student progress in the four essential macro-skills are conducted every 6 weeks. Attendance, classroom participation, and homework completion, as well as Progress Test scores, are considered when students are promoted to the next Proficiency Level.

COURSE STRUCTURE

The course is a 84-week course with 10 weeks allocated for successful completion of every proficiency level:

IELTS Preparation course will help you prepare for the IELTS test so you can achieve your ultimate score. In the IELTS course you will: ·learn the format of all four sections of the test: reading, writing, listening and speaking, ·learn the skills and exam strategies needed to achieve your target IELTS score, ·Improve your overall English language proficiency, ·expand your vocabulary range and improve grammar accuracy, ·do regular IELTS mock tests.

COURSE STRUCTURE

Our IELTS Course is a 24-week course that consist of 2 Levels (12 Weeks IELTS Foundation and 12 Weeks IELTS Advanced)

Each level includes a 2-week scheduled break, with an option for up to 2 additional weeks.

The overall duration ranges from a minimum of 28 weeks (with a 2-week break per level) to a maximum of 32 weeks (with a 4-week break per level)

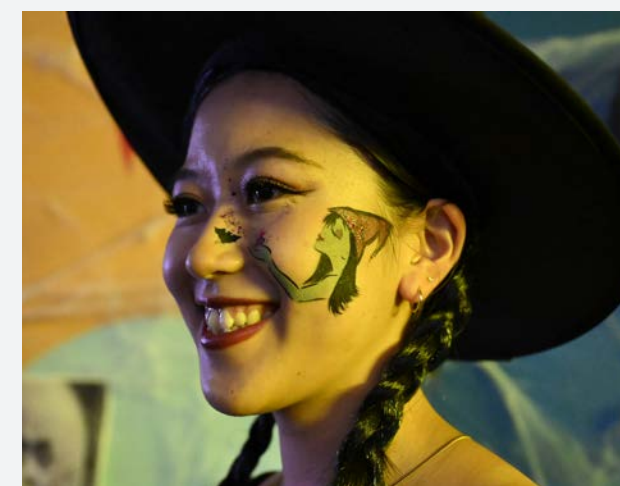
